The plans for the 2012 Summer Concert Series have been finalized. Many thanks to Councilman Larry Sylver and the Recreation Committee for putting all the details together. All concerts are held in the park behind Village Hall. A complete list of concerts can be found on page 2 and on our website. The July concerts are:

July 21- Saturday- Annual Community Garage Sale, and Farmer's Market, sponsored by Sirna's Farm & Market, from 9am to 2pm. Music is being provided by DJ Michael Pendleton from 12 pm to 2 pm, sponsored by Chagrin Valley Engineering, LTD.

July 22- Concert by Blue Cadillac from 5-7 pm sponsored by Waste Management.

I am very happy to inform you that we received three additional grants to help fund various projects. The Ohio Public Works Commission announced they are funding the following projects:

Pettibone Road Realignment- A grant and loan in the amount of \$544,545 (\$272,272 grant and \$272,273 loan) with a total project cost of \$680,681.

Pergl Road Sanitary Sewer Project- Phase II- A grant and a loan in the amount of \$349,999 (\$174,999 grant and \$175,000 loan) with a total project cost of \$534,555.

Richmond / Pettibone Road Roundabout- The Village of Oakwood and Glenwillow were awarded a grant/loan for 90% of the total project cost. The total cost for the project is \$611,000.

Many thanks to Mike Henry and his entire team of Chagrin Valley Engineering for doing such a great job on behalf of the Village on securing these funds.

Summer will also bring several construction projects to our village. When it is possible, we will try to have the roads and/or intersections open to traffic however, sometimes that will not be possible. We appreciate your patience and understanding during the next couple of months. We anticipate the following projects will be under construction this year:

Austin Powder Bridge Replacement- Austin Powder Drive is closed to through traffic. Local traffic will have access to North and South Village Lane from the South and Odd Fellows camp will have access from the North. Detours will be posted. Please refer to the details on Page 3.

Broadway/ Richmond Intersection Realignment- due to start in September. Traffic is expected to be maintained.

Pergl Road Sanitary Sewer Phase I- Construction bid was awarded on July 11th to Fortuna Excavating. Construction will start in August or September of 2012 and be finished by the end of the year.

Again we ask for your patience and understanding while driving near the construction areas. Please feel free to contact my office if you have any questions about any of these projects.

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JOHN D. BROWN MULTI-PURPOSE TRAIL DEDICATION

On June 6, Village Council named the Pettibone Road Multi-Purpose Trail the "John D. Brown Multi-Purpose Trail" in honor of Mr. Brown's commitment and service to the Village for over 35 years as our Law Director. The trail was constructed in 2008/2009 with grant funds from the Ohio Dept. of Natural Resources, Cuyahoga County Community Development Block Grant and local monies from Glenwillow. The multi-purpose trail runs along Pettibone Road from Richmond Road to Austin Powder Drive. It serves as a major connection of nearby trails between Oakwood, the City of Solon and the Metroparks. The trail is 10-feet wide, constructed with an asphalt surface and is extensively used by residents walking, riding bikes and jogging.

Mr. Brown provided not only excellent legal counsel to the Village over his 35 years of service but also offered his expertise in environmental law and public finance. His contributions to the Village enabled our community to grow into a vibrant residential and commercial/industrial Village. His extraordinary work can be seen everywhere throughout the Village. Mr. Brown retired from the Village in March, 2010

RAIN GARDEN WORKSHOP

Rain Gardens are attractive landscaped areas planned with perennial native plants which like to have lots of water. Rain gardens are designed to increase infiltration, allowing rain and snow melt to seep naturally into the ground. Benefits of a rain garden: They recharge groundwater supply, prevent water quality problems, provide habitat for birds and butterflies, a great looking landscape feature. Chris Hartman, with Chagrin Valley Engineering, LTD. will conduct a workshop on planning designing and installing a rain garden with plants that absorb standing water, remove pollutants and look beautiful, at the same time minimizing the negative effects of storm water runoff.

CALL 8-1-1 BEFORE YOU DIG


If you are doing any type of construction or repairs to your property this summer, it is imperative that you CALL 8-1-1 BEFORE YOU DIG OR EXCAVATE. This is a state law to ensure the safety of you and others when excavating for any reason.

This law was enacted in order to prevent potential injuries from accidental utility line digging. The 8-1-1 line or 1-800-362-2764 is the Ohio Utilities Protection Services and they will alert Dominion and other participating utilities of your plans to dig. They will also ask the appropriate utility company to make their underground lines so they are not interrupted in the excavation.


AUSTIN POWDER BRIDGE REPLACEMENT

The Austin Powder Bridge over Beaver Meadows Creek is schedule to be replaced beginning this month. The road will be closed to through traffic. Local traffic will have access to North and South Village Lane from the South and Odd Fellows camp will have access from the North. There will be a detour posted that requires North bound traffic to go East on Pettibone Road to North Cochran Road to Austin Powder Drive. Southbound Austin Powder Drive traffic will be required to go south on Cochran to West on Pettibone Road to Austin Powder. Please watch for the posted signs.

The contractor for the \$1 Million Dollar bridge replacement is Suburban Maintenance & Construction, Inc. The project will be paid for by Cuyahoga County Dept. of Public Works and the Village of Glenwillow. The project is expected to be completed by December, 2012.

SUMMER SAFETY RULES

Now that Summer is officially here, a couple of items to ensure the safety of you and your family.

1. Use insect repellents that contain DEET, picaridin or lemon eucalyptus oil.
2. Eliminate potential mosquito breeding sites by removing unused tires and other containers that hold water.
3. Keep pools and hot tubs well covered and preferably empty when not in use.
4. Keep cold foods refrigerated during hot weather days,
5. During hot weather, increase your fluid intake regardless of your activity level. Avoid alcoholic beverages which cause you to lose more fluid.
6. Be careful when working outside in hot weather.
7. Reduce risk of sunburn by limiting outdoor activities during daylight hours and always use sun protection with at least a SPF of 15 or higher.
8. Swim only in approved areas and never swim alone.
9. Never leave children alone or near the pool or at the beach even for one minute.
10. Teach your children how to swim or enroll them in swimming classes.
11. Keep rescue equipment such as a shepherd's hook - a long pole with a hook on the end, a life preserver and a telephone near the pool.

PERGL ROAD SANITARY SEWER UPDATE



Over the last several years the Village has been working with the Cuyahoga County Board of Health and the Ohio EPA to assure the best options are made available for the Village residents that currently do not have access to local gravity sewers.

As part of this effort, the Village has applied for State funding to install these sewers. Last year, we were successful to secure over \$330,000 in funding for Phase I of the Pergl Road Sanitary Sewer. Phase I includes extending the sanitary sewer from Tinker's Valley Dr. to Pergl Rd. to Mello Dr. and up to 27620 Pergl Rd.

We are expecting the project to be completed by the end of this year.

Recently, we were notified that we have secured almost \$350,000 for the funding of Phase II of the Pergl Road Sanitary Sewers. The funding is through the Ohio Public Works Commission. Because of this funding, the Village is moving forward with the design of Phase II. Phase II will include all properties of Annetta Drive and all properties east of 27750 Pergl Road. We are expecting the design to be completed by this fall, and construction to start in spring/summer '13 with final completion by the end of 2013.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS DISPOSAL

The Village will be holding a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day on Saturday, August 18th. This event is an opportunity to dispose of household materials that are not to be disposed of with your regular rubbish collection. Below is a list of materials that will be accepted and not accepted at this collection. Please bring all items you would like disposed to 28555 Pettibone Road between 8:00 AM to 12:00 noon. - Oil or solvent-based paint, sealers, primers, or coatings (aerosols or liquids)
- Varnishes, polyurethanes, shellacs
- Paint thinner, mineral spirits, turpentine
- Pesticides, herbicides, fungicides
- Caustic household cleaners
- Pool chemicals
- Automotive fluids, motor oil, car batteries
- Adhesives, roof tar, driveway sealer
- Kerosene, gasoline, lighter fluid
- Mercury, fluorescent bulbs
(6 ft. length max.)

Materials NOT accepted:

- Latex paint
- Explosives, gun powder, ammunition, flares
- Medical waste, pharmaceuticals, medicine, sharps
- Radioactive waste (i.e. smoke detectors)
- Tires
- Electronics, appliances
- Business or commercial waste

WATER BILLING RATE CHANGE
