MAYOR MARK A. CEGELKA:

- Ptl. Jack Soederstrom’s by-pass surgery was successful and he went home on Monday, March 14th. We hope that he has a speedy recovery.
- The Mayor will be out of town March 25 to April 3, 2011.
- Councilman John Baca will be out of town from April 7 to April 17, 2011.
- The service employees are currently painting the Police Department and should be completed by the end of this week. Carpet will be installed after the painting is done.
- On Saturday, March 26 the carpets in the Administration Building and Building Dept. will be cleaned. On Saturday, April 9, 2011, the floors will be buffed in the Administration Hall and Building Department Hall and kitchen.
- A reminder if you need your Codified Ordinances updated Daisy or Lori can do that for you.
- The annual meeting of the Reserve at Tinkers Creek Homeowners Association was well attended with 30-40 residents from the area. The Village Staff and Mayor introduced

themselves to attendees and gave a brief summary of our services to the residents. Smoke detectors were given out at this meeting.
