
The final concert in Glenwillow was a success. Weather was tremendous, turn-out was great, and all had a good time.

Listed below are items of interest and information:

- Flu Shots are scheduled for Tuesday, October 23rd at the Village Hall. Please call to register. The time frame is from 9:00 AM to 10:30 AM.
- Snow removal forms for senior citizens will be mailed out to all seniors by October 15, 2007.
- The Glenwillow Police Department has recently purchased a 2008 Ford Explorer and four new shotguns. MDTs, Mobile Data Terminals, have been installed in all of the police cars. They can retrieve driver license and wanted person information immediately from their cars. This also allows communication with other law enforcement agencies. We have hired two part-time police officers. Nick Sidor and George Butina have been sworn in and are in training. The Police Department currently has much of the up to date technology to protect and serve the residents in the Village of Glenwillow.
- The Service Department has a new addition to their team. Leslie Dickard has been hired as a full time employee. He brings to the Village his expertise in car maintenance, truck repairs, body work and paint, heavy equipment operation, and certifications in some aspects of building. The Service Department is responsible for maintaining all the Village streets and properties including grounds and buildings. Currently, the Village has four (4) full time employees and they also utilize part time employees to handle work as needed. The Village has a full compliment of trucks, tractors, and other equipment to accomplish all of the duties.
- The Building Department hours have been changed to 8 AM—4 PM, Monday through Friday, due to numerous commercial projects.

- The month of October is "Domestic Violence Awareness Month". The Village of Glenwillow Codified Ordinance 537.14 DOMESTIC VIOLENCE states:
 - A) No person shall knowingly cause or attempt to cause physical harm to a family or household member
 - B) No person shall recklessly cause serious physical harm to a family or household member
 - C) No person, by threat of force, shall knowingly cause a family or household member to believe that the offender will cause imminent physical harm to the family or household member.
